2011 - May 2017 Adel has added \$132,890,436 in valuation - in less than 6.5 years we have increased valuations by almost 60%. In 2017 the average home value with w/ abated values = \$193,150.

#### Road Use Tax (RUT)

RUT funding is at approx. \$120 per capita (source of per capita funding – State of Iowa website). On the six years of growth (611 new population x \$120) alone it translates to \$73,320 /yr. or \$733,200 additional RUT revenue Adel will received between 2020 and 2029.

First estimate was \$350,000 annual based on \$35 million in sales. FY 2017 when reconciled will be over \$500,000, or \$50 million in sales – and almost 43% increase in economic activity for Adel.

Perspective: our taxable valuation for 2016 is \$121,554,233. In order to raise \$500,000 we would increase our levy by \$4.16 almost 30%.

After covering the direct (e.g., engineering) and indirect (e.g., staff) costs, the remaining permit fees reduce the general fund levy. The water and sewer fees reduce the debt service levy. The result is lower taxes for existing taxpayers as demonstrated in the Property Tax and Tax Revenue History table above.

The average fees paid by a homeowner is \$1,625
